PRESIDENT & EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

ONTARIO

Since our last Esprit in the fall, the Ontario Liberals tabled their Budget. On April 27th it was presented to the Legislature and announced to be the first balanced budget in a decade. However within the Developmental Service Sector it has been met with mixed reactions. Despite concerted lobbying by the sector for a modest increase in each of the next three years, there was no increase for agencies' operating budgets. This makes the 8th year in a row that this has occurred, and will significantly increase financial pressures on organizations.

However, there were announcements of funding for the following:

- The Government will invest \$677 million over four years to help keep people out of crises and give more people the supports that are right for them
- In 2017-18 the investment will be over \$130 million annualized dollars plus an additional \$5 million in infrastructure funds to:
 - o Provide over 375 additional residential developmental services placements for individuals with urgent needs and youth transitioning from the child welfare system
 - Support 1,000 additional adults with developmental disabilities to participate in their communities through the Passport program
- Over the next two years the Government will work with families and community partners to transition over 400 young adults currently in the children's system in adult developmental services
- ODSP rates will increase by 2% effective September 2017
- For ODSP recipients, effective January 2018, the cash and other liquid asset limits will be increased from \$5,000 to \$40,000 for single individuals, and from \$7,500 to \$50,000 for couples
- Effective September 2017, income exemption for cash gifts will be increased from \$6,000 up to \$10,000 per year in both ODSP and Ontario Works

OMBUDSMAN

As we reported in the last edition of Esprit in the fall, the Ontario Ombudsman's Office had released their report on the DS sector in Ontario. As also noted, the Minister had committed to reporting back to the Ombudsman every six months on the progress being made with respect to the recommendations in his report. 


another. Clarence called Peter, John Boy and was always looking out for Peter. He was a gruff old timer, but Peter, in his true style made that man smile.



JOANNE EVELYN SMITH (February 17, 1956 - May 7, 2017)



Every Canadian Counts Update

The Every Canadian Counts Coalition attended the IIDL CONFERENCE (The International Initiative on Disability Leadership) in Sydney, Australia February 27 - March 2.

The outcomes from that meeting included:

- Minister Qualtrough's commitment to examine the national disability insurance option. This came in response to a question from the CEO of the March of Dimes Canada in which Minister Qualtrough stated that following the passage of the Accessibility Act the government will be looking to introduce something like the NDIS of Australia.
- ECC contacts and relations established with NDIS senior administrators.
- Presentations on NDIS operational issues and challenges in implementation. These presentations are available upon request by contacting info@everycanadiancounts.com.
